Preconference Sessions:

Tier 1 Battlefield Acupuncture **CE**

Speaker: Col (ret) Lewis Hofmann, MD, FAAP

Abstract: Quickly delivering rapid pain relief with minimal side effects can have great advantages in all clinical arenas. This practical, hands-on workshop is designed to teach non-acupuncturist providers* (physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, and dentists) a simple and highly effective protocol to reduce pain utilizing auricular acupuncture. Students will learn to place indwelling needles in five specific points on each ear and leave the course confident to immediately utilize this technique in their practice. Upon successful completion of the course, students will receive a credentialing letter which will allow them to add Battlefield Acupuncture to their credentials profile in the DoD and VA systems.

*This workshop is open to anyone interested. However, being trained alone does not allow you to practice. You then need to get credentials from the hospital or clinic where you work.

Course Objectives

1. Upon completion of this course, students will:
2. Understand the history of acupuncture and current theories of how BFA works.
3. Appropriately select patients for BFA: Recognize conditions which BFA can treat, identify patients who should not receive BFA, and understand the military-unique implications of acupuncture treatment.
4. Master performance of BFA: Obtain and document informed consent; locate and sequentially needle the BFA points using proper aseptic technique; appreciate the possible complications of BFA and be prepared to manage them; identify, understand and convey post-procedure instructions and precautions; and demonstrate proper documentation of a BFA treatment.
5. Know how to order BFA supplies.
6. Know how to access acupuncture consultation, if needed.

Students will be required to successfully pass both a written and practical skills examination in order to obtain a BFA certificate of training.

Change the Map: Opioid Overdose Reversal Training **CE,**

Abstract: According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), more than 2 million people in the US struggle with an opioid use disorder. In 2017, opioids were involved in 47,600 overdose deaths. Responding to U.S. Surgeon General Vice Admiral Jerome M. Adams' advisory to carry naloxone, PACE Region 3 and Maryland Department of Health Opioid Overdose collaborated to develop and execute a marathon Opioid Overdose Reversal Training at the 2019 The Society of Federal Health Professionals (AMSUS). The training is comprised of a lecture and breakout sessions. During the lecture, trainees will receive an overview of opioid and naloxone. In the breakout sessions, trainees will be given scenarios to assess their ability to recognize signs and symptoms of an opioid overdose and given test kits to administer the naloxone in two different available forms. Through partnership, there is hope to Change the Map with USPHS Officers and civilians trained with the necessary knowledge to save lives in their local communities using Naloxone.
