



Mark A. Ediger, M.D., M.P.H.
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Summary

Dr. Mark Ediger is a dual board-certified physician in Family Medicine and Aerospace Medicine and a 32-year military Veteran. He is a Senior Flight Surgeon and served as Command Surgeon for three Major Commands. His command experience includes Medical Group command in combat operations. As the 22nd Surgeon General of the United States Air Force, Dr. Ediger led the design and implementation of Trusted Care, a high reliability model employed throughout the Air Force Medical Service as a cultural commitment to safe care and continuous improvement. He also led establishment of new standards and processes for sustaining the readiness of the deployable medical forces. Dr. Ediger subsequently advised the Veterans Health Administration on its high reliability strategy and was lead author for a series of reports on VHA's response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Dr. Ediger currently serves as a Specialist Executive in Deloitte's Federal Health consulting practice. He supports federal health agencies including the Veterans Administration and the Military Health System.

Dr. Ediger earned undergraduate and Doctor of Medicine degrees from the University of Missouri-Kansas City and a Master of Public Health degree from the University of Texas. He completed specialty training in Family Medicine at Wake Forest University and Aerospace Medicine at the US Air Force School of Aerospace Medicine.

Dr. Ediger serves on the Board of Directors for the Association of Military Surgeons of the United States (AMSUS). He also serves as an Adjuvant Director for the Marine Corps Scholarship Foundation.
