



Dorothy A. Hogg, MSN, WHNP-BC

Summary

Lt Gen (ret) Dorothy Hogg is a board certified Women's Health Nurse Practitioner and a 37-year military Veteran. As the 23rd Surgeon General of the United States Air Force, Lt Gen (ret) Hogg served as advisor to the Secretary of the Air Force, the Air Force Chief of Staff and the Chief of Space Operations, as well as the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Health Affairs on strategic systems-level matters pertaining to medical aspects of the air expeditionary force and the health of Airmen and Guardians. She directed, guided, and managed a \$6.1 billion, 44,000-person integrated healthcare delivery and readiness system serving 2.6 million beneficiaries at 76 military treatment facilities worldwide. During her tenure, Lt Gen (ret) Hogg directed and guided the largest Military Medical transformation giving healthcare to a civilian agency, the Defense Health Agency and redesigning medical readiness. She transformed the Air Force Operations Agency into the Air Force Medical Readiness Agency with its primary focus on military medical readiness. As the first Space Force Surgeon General, Lt Gen (ret) Hogg designed and implemented the Space Forces' medical support from the Headquarters all the way down to individual units. Also during her tenure, Lt Gen Hogg led, directed, and advised senior leaders and the Defense Health Agency on COVID operations and designed 4 COVID hospital deployable units and deployable immunization units to support our civilian partners. Lt Gen (ret) Hogg is a recognized leader in healthcare transformation and leadership.

Background

Dorothy Hogg earned her undergraduate nursing degree from the University of Southern Maine, a Masters of Nursing from Medical University of South Carolina and a Masters in Public Administration from Troy State University. She completed specialty training as a certified Women's Health Nurse Practitioner from the military and later received her board certification in the same field. While serving in the Air Force, her experience includes Ob/Gyn staff nurse, nurse manager, Flight Commander, Squadron Commander, Hospital Commander, Major Command Deputy Surgeon (twice), Air Force Chief Nurse prior to serving as the Air Force Deputy Surgeon General and Surgeon General from 2015 to 2021. She also served as the Air Expeditionary Surgeon General at Al Udeid Air Base, Qatar in support of operations Enduring Freedom and Iraqi Freedom.
